Disposal

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Intended Use

The appliance is designed for domestic use inside the house, or in similar applications such as staff kitchen areas in working environments, farm houses, by clients in hotels, motels or other residential environments, and bed and breakfast environments. It is not intended for commercial or industrial use. Do not use it for purposes other than that for which it was designed.

Changes or modifications to the device are not allowed. Unintended use may cause hazards and loss of warranty claims.

Before Switching on the Appliance for the First Time Do...

- ▶ make sure all packaging is removed and is kept out of children's reach.
- ▶ make sure that the electrical information on the rating plate agrees with the power supply. If it does not, contact an electrician.
- use a separate earthed socket for the power supply. The appliance must be earthed.
- ▶ make sure the plug is easy accessible.
- ▶ make sure only the delivered electric cable and hose set are used.
- ▶ hold the plug and not the electric cable when unplugging the power supply.
- ▶ make sure not to damage the electric cable and the plug. If dam aged, have it replaced by an electrician.
- ▶ make sure the hose joints and connections are firm and there is no leakage.

Do not...

- ★ install or use the appliance where the temperature is below 5 °C. use multi-plug adapters and extension cables.
- * let persons, children included, with reduced physical sensory, reduced mental functions or lack of experience and knowledge use the appliance if not supervised by a person responsible for their safety.
- * put flammable products or items that are wet with flammable products in, near, or on theappliance.

During Daily Use

- ▶ supervise children to prevent them playing with the appliance.
- put sharp pointed objects (e.g. knives) in a way that there is no danger of injury.

Do not...

- x open the door while a programme operates. The appliance can release hot steam.
- * keep the appliance door open without supervision to prevent tripping and falling.
- x let children or pets come close to the appliance when the door is open.
- x sit or place heavy items on the open door.
- * remove the dishes from the appliance until the programme is completed. There can still be detergent on the dishes.
- x drink the water in the appliance. The water may be contaminated with detergent residues.
- x cover any ventilation openings in the base by a carpet or similar object.
- * use water spray or steam to clean the appliance.
- * let the children make the cleaning and user maintenance without supervision.

WARNING:

Some dishwasher detergents are strongly alkaline. They can be extremely dangerous if swallowed. Avoid contact with the skin and eyes and keep children away from the dishwasher when the door is open. Check that the detergent receptacle is empty after completion of the wash cycle.

- The door is not left in the open position since this could present a tripping hazard.
- Warning: Knives and other utensils with sharp points must be loaded in the basket with their points down or placed in a horizontal position.
- Only use hose-set provided by manufacture, old hose-set cannot be reused.


Any installation may be carried out only by a qualitied technician refer to section SAFETY.

Free Standing Installation


Install the appliance on solid ground. Adjust accurately all feet to get a firm, horizontal position.



Only with a correct level the appliance door closes and seals correctly.



Installation under Worktop



- Optional:Remove the work top of the appliance.
- 2. Adjust accurately all feet to get a firm level position.
- 3. Stick the water-proof sticker on the bottom of the countertop.
- 4. Install the appliance carefully into the recess.




WARNING!

If used as free standing appliance again, the worktop must be remounted.

- 5. The dimensions of the recess should at least agree with the dimensions in the figure.
- 6. After installation, the minmum gap between the side planel and the cupboard is 1mm, and the minmum gap between the rear and the cupboard is 10mm. The top gap is controlled by adjusting the feet.
- 7. Put the appliance adjacent to the slot. Make sure that all connections (water, drain water, power) are neatly positioned and connected.


Fresh Water Connection



IMPORTANT!

- ▶ The appliance should be connected to the water main using the new water inlet hose supplied. Old hoses should not be used.
- Do not shorten the inlet hose.
- 1. Take note of water connection requirements.
 - ▶ The dishwasher has a single valve water connection.
 - ▶ We recommend a cold water connection for best performance and energy efficiency.
 - ▶ The incoming water temperature should not exceed 25°C.
- 2. Take note of the permitted water pressure extremes.
 - Lowest: $0.3 \text{ bar} = 3 \text{ N/cm}^2 = 30 \text{kPa}$
 - ▶ Where pressure is below I bar, contact a qualified plumber.
 - \blacktriangleright Highest: 10 bar = 100 N/cm² = IMPa
 - ▶ Where pressure is above 10 bar, a pressure reduction valve must be installed. Contact a qualified plumber.
- 3. Connect the water inlet hose to an accessible water tap with a 3/4" BSP connector (see fig.A). Ensure that there is no kink in the inlet hose that could restrict the flow of water. A 90° bend requires a minimum height of 200 mm for a kink-free curve.
 - ▶ Ensure incoming water is clear. If the water pipes have not been used for a long period of time, let the water run to make sure it is clear with no impurities. Not doing so may result in the water inlet hose getting blocked and damaging the appliance.
 - ▶ If required, use a filter insert to filter out deposits from the piping. The filter insert is available from your Authorised Service Centre or Customer Care.
- 4. Tighten the hose coupling a further half turn after seal contact.
- 5. Check that the connection does not leak.


Drain Water Connection



Fix the water drain hose properly to the piping. The hose has to reach at one point a height between 400 and 850 mm above the appliance bottom line.

An extension hose for the water drain hose must not exceed a total length of 4 m and must have the same diameter as the water drain hose.


Following connections are possible:



Drain hose to sink


- ► Hang the drain hose with the U-support over the edge of a sink with adequate size.
- Protect the U-support sufficiently against slipping.

Drain hose to waste water connection



- ► The internal diameter of the stand pipe with vent-hole must be minimum 40 mm.
- Put the drain hose for approx.80 mm in the wastewater pipe.
- Attach the U-support and secure it sufficiently


Drain hose to sink connection



- When connecting the drain hose to a sink trap with a drain hose spigot, make sure that the drain hose is supported to the height of the bench.
- Ensure the drain spigot has a minimum hole diameter of 15 mm and it has been drilled out.

NZ AU Installation

Power connection



As shown in the figure, the power supply is plugged into an externally accessible place through the service hole for easy plugging.




CAUTION!

Ensure always that all connections (power supply, drain and fresh water hose) are firm, dry and leak free.

Take care these parts are never to be crushed, kinked, or twisted If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the service agent (see warranty card) in order to avoid a hazard.





Time & Info display

During any selection the display shows by flashing related information like

- ▶ Programme cycle time
- ▶ Programme start delay time
- ▶ Error codes and service information

After start of an operation it dispalys without flashing

- ▶ Remaining time in hours of a delayed programme starts, e.g. 24h
- ▶ Remaining programme cycle time in hours + minutes, e.g. \ ... \

While running it may vary due to local conditions and daily working load.

I). The appliance senses the type of soil and the quantity of items in the baskets. It automatically adjusts the temperature and quantity of water, energy consumption and programme duration.

^{2).} With this programme you can wash a load with fresh soil. It gives good washing results in a short time.

First Steps

Remove all packaging materials, keep them out of children's reach and dispose them in an environmentally friendly manner. There could be water residue inside the appliance due to quality checks in the factory.

Perform in the following steps:

- I. Install the appliance.
 - ▶ Refer to section INSTALLATION.
- 2. Only for use of Multitabs: Adjust the rinse aid setting.
 - ▶ Refer to section DIFFERENT SETTINGS FOR RINSE AID.
- 3. Fill the rinse aid dispenser.
 - ▶ Refer to section HOW TO FILL THE RINSE AID DISPENSER.
- 4. Open the water tap.
- 5. Start any wash programme (apart from Rinse programme) with detergent but no load to remove possible manufacturing residues.

Activate / De-Activate the Buzzer

An accoustic signal informs about the end of a programme. This signal can be switched off.

Refer to section HOW TO ADJUST SETTINGS and select the setting:

- ▶ If the display shows ⊢□ the signal is switched off.
- ▶ If the display shows 🖥 i the signal is switched on.

Different Settings for Rinse Aid

Rinse aid is added during the last rinsing phase to dry the dishes without streaks and stains.

Detergent (e.g. powder, tablets, ...)

► requires separate rinse aid:
Factory default setting: ☐ .No settings are necessary.
The rinse aid is added from the rinse aid dispenser only.

Detergent with multifunction (e.g. Multitabs)

combine detergent and rinse aid:

The rinse aid setting should be adjust to $\Box\Box$. Please use the setting instructions in section HOW TO ADJUST SETTINGS and select the \Box -setting.

The rinse aid is added from the rinse aid dispenser in addition to the multitabs rinse aid.

Setting d - cuts off the rinse aid dosage and the rinse aid indication. The higher the value for the higher the dosage.


Usually the recommended setting performs well. In case of streaks, stains, shimmer etc., refer to section TROUBLESHOOTING.

How to fill the Rinse Aid Dispenser



CAUTION!

Only use rinse aid for dishwashers.
Other products can cause damage to the appliance.



Lift the cover open and pour rinse aid into the opening.

Do not fill exceeding the MAX line. Take care not to spill any onto the door or detergent bucket.



Close the cover, ensuring it clicks shut.

Powder detergent quantity recommendations

Use the table below to determine the optimal powder detergent quantity for each wash programme.

If the water is hard in your area, more detergent may be required. Refer to 'Water Hardness' for more details.

How to Adjust Settings

Adjust the Rinse Aid level

- I. The appliance is switched on.
- 2. Press and hold ≫ about 3 seconds until:
 - ▶ The display shows the current Rinse Aid setting (the default is $\neg \Box$).
- 3. Press $\stackrel{\square}{}$ to change the Rinse Aid setting in steps between $\stackrel{\square}{}$ (minimum dispense, no rinse aid is set) and $\stackrel{\square}{}$ (maximum dispense, represents putting in 6ml rinse aid).
- 4. Press > ∥ to save the option.
- 5. To exit the Rinse Aid menu, press and hold (1) for I second.

Activate / De-Activate the Buzzer

- I. The appliance is switched on.
- 2. Press and hold >> for about 3 seconds until:
 - ▶ The display shows the current Rinse Aid setting.
- 3. Press >>> to scroll to the buzzer menu.
- 4. The display will show $\frac{1}{10}$ (buzzer off) or $\frac{1}{10}$ (buzzer on).
- 5. Press (L) to toggle between [1] (buzzer off) or [1] (buzzer on),
- 6. Press | to save the option.
- 7. To exit, press and hold (I second.

Child lock

This feature disables all the buttons on the dishwasher. If any other buttons are pressed while Child lock is activated, the Child lock indicator will flash for a few seconds.

- I. To activate Child lock, press (□) and | □ | | for 3 seconds.
- 2. The display will remain on (if no programme has been started it will continue to flash while the control panel is locked).
- 3. To cancel Child lock, press (L) and | | for 3 seconds.

Before first use

Dishwasher operation

- I. Load the baskets.
- 2. Press the ON/OFF button \bigcirc to activate the appliance.
 - ▶ If the rinse aid indicator is on, fill the rinse aid dispenser and reset the rinse aid indicator, refer to section HOW TO RESET THE RINSE AID IDNICATOR
- 3. Add the detergent; refer to section DETERGENT.
- 4. Close the door.
- 5. Set the programme according to the type of load and how dirty the dishes, cups and cutlery are.
- 6. Maybe select a start delay time.
- 7. Press the START / PAUSE button >|| to start the programme.
- 8. After programme end the appliance change to auto off. Unload the baskets.

How to Reset Rinse Aid Indicator

The rinse aid indicator is on:

- 1. Always completely fill the rinse aid before starting the next wash cycle.
- 2. After adding Rinse Aid, the indicator lights off.

Load the Baskets



With delicate glasses and porcelain make sure they are labelled dishwasher-proof.

- ✗ Do not put in the appliance items made of wood, horn, aluminium, pewter and copper.
- Do not put in the appliance items that can absorb water (sponges, household cloths).
- ▶ Only use the appliance to wash items that are dishwasher-safe.
- ▶ Remove remaining food from the items.
- ▶ Soften burned food on the items before washing.
- Put hollow items (cups, glasses and pans) with the opening down.
- Put items with deep hollows in a slanted position.
- Mix spoons with other cutlery to prevent them to bond together.
- ▶ Make sure that cutlery and dishes do not bond together and there is a gap between each item.
- Make sure that glasses do not touch other glasses.
- Put small items in the cutlery basket.
- Put light items in the upper basket. Make sure that the items do not move.
- Make sure that the spray arms can move freely before you start a programme.




If jingling noises are heard during a programme run: Check that the dishes and glassware have a firm position.



Place heavily soiled items (like pots and pans or dinner plates) in the bottom basket. The more powerful spray jet provides a better dishwashing result.

Upper baskets



▶ The upper basket is designed to hold items like glasses, cups, saucers, plates, small bowls and shallow pans.

Adjusting the height of the upper basket

Adjust the height of the upper basket to make space for taller items. The basket must be empty before the height is adjusted. Both sides of the basket must be adjusted to the same height.



High position


When the middle shelf slide is in the assembly position of wheel I and wheel 2, the middle shelf is in the high position.

Low position

When the middle shelf slide is in the assembly position of wheel 2 and wheel 3, the middle shelf is in the low position.

Foldaway cup racks

Adjust the height to suit or fold out of the way to make space for other items. Use the notches to support wine glass stems.



To adjust height


- I. Fold up to unlock.
- 2. Adjust the height to suit by sliding up or down.
- 3. Fold back down to lock in position.

Lower basket



- Place the largest items here: pots, pans, lids, serving dishes and bowls.
- ► Fold down the tines to place pots and pans flat on the pottom.
- Ensure dishware items do not block the spray arm above from rotating.
- ► If you need more height for tall items, you can raise the upper basket. See instructions on previous pages.

Cutlery basket



- ► Mix spoons with other cutlery to prevent them to bond together.
- ► Use the grid element in order to separate the cutlery.
- ► Place cutlery with the handles down for better washing results.
- ► If long items may block the spray arm find a horizontal positioning in the upper basket.

CAUTION!



Put sharp and pointed items with the blade pointing downward to keep them out of harm's way.


Detergent



Please use only a dedicated dishwasher detergent and follow the related instructions and dosage on its package.

Using powder detergent

For powder detergent quantities, refer to the following 'Powder detergent quantity recommendations' table and the detergent manufacturer's guidance. No detergent is needed for RINSE.



Check that the dispenser is empty and dry. Add powder detergent or tablets to the detergent dispenser.



Remove any excess detergent then slide the cover closed. It will click into place. If required, add additional detergent to the pre-wash compartment on top of the dispenser.

When washing heavily soiled dishware in hard water, more detergent may be required. Refer to 'Powder detergent quantity recommendations'.

Multitabs

These Multitabs detergent tablets could include two different agents for water softening, rinse aid and other functions. The softener and rinse aid setting must be adjusted according to section BEFORE FIRST USE. Usually the default setting performs well. If there are streaks, stains, shimmer etc., refer to section TROUBLESHOOTING and BEFORE FIRST USE.



Detergent tablets do not fully dissolve with short programmes. That may cause bad washing results and detergent residues.

If detergent without multifunction should be used again:

- I. Save 3 to 5 tablets.
- 2. Adjust the softener and rinse aid setting according to section BEFORE FIRST USE.
- 3. Use Multitabs detergent tablets for the next 3 to 5 wash cycles.

Start a Programme

- I. Close the door.
- 2. Press the ON/OFF button(|).
- 3. Press the program button you want to select and then the required programme indicator flashes.
 - Additionally the display shows the programme run-time.
- 4. If need select a start time for a delay start, refer to section START A PROGRAMME WITH DELAY
- 5. Press the START/PAUSE button ▷|| to activate the programme or the delay start.

The programme starts. The display acts now as countdown of the remaining run-time.



The appliance remembers the last programme you used. The next time the appliance is switched on, the appliance pre-selects the programme used last time.

Interrupt a Running Programme

To interrupt a running programme:

- Press the START/PAUSE button $|\cdot|$. The displayed cycle time is flashing.
- Open the door.

To continue a paused programme:

Close the door and press the button $|\cdot|$ to continue the programme from the point of interruption. To prevent poor wash performance, do not leave the door open for a long time.

Activate / Deactivate options

On some models, you can combine a washing program and an additional function program to operate.

- I. Switch on the appliance.
- 2. press \triangleright to select the wash programme, The display shows the duration of the programme.
- 3. If needed, select \gg and it can be matched with the current washing procedure.
- 4. Press the button | □ to start the program.

Start a Programme with Delay

Set a start time by the following procedure in order to delay a programme start:

- I. Set a programme.
- 2. Press the reservation button (L) until the display shows the required delay time (from 1 to 24hours).
- 3. Press the START/PAUSE button $|\mathbf{x}|$.
 - ▶ The display shows the countdown of the start delay.
 - ▶ When the countdown is completed, the programme starts.

Cancel a Delayed Start

When the current reservation time is displayed for 24h, press the reservation button again to cancel the reservation. Afterwards the display shows with the duration time for the set programme.

Cancel Start Delay Programme

Press the ON/OFF button (1) for about I second.

- ▶ The start delay is cancelled.
- ▶ The programme is aborted.
- ▶ The appliance is switched off.

Start a new programme and a delayed start if needed.



CAUTION!

If a programme will be aborted in the process of washing dishes, the residue of detergent remains on the dishes. These can cause damage to health. Make sure to rinse off the detergent residues completely before using these dishes again.



If the door will be opened immediately after the end of programme, hot steam can escape. Danger of scalding. Open the door carefully.



Make sure that there is detergent in the detergent dispenser before start a new programme.

Care and Cleaning

Cleaning the filter, spray arms and filter plate

Disconnect the dishwasher from the power supply and allow it to cool before undertaking any cleaning or maintenance.

We recommend that the drain filter and filter plate are removed and cleaned once a month or whenever there is evidence of food particles. The spray arms in normal use should require cleaning less frequently. Lower and upper spray arms can be shaken to remove any foreign material, cleaned in hot water, then rinsed in clean water.

The dishwasher must be used with the filter plate, drain filter and spray arms correctly in place. If using a dishwasher cleaner or descaler, refer to manufacturer instructions.

Removing and cleaning the filter



Twist the filter anti-clockwise to release. Lift to remove.




Twist the filter handle anti-clockwise to release. Lift to remove from the filter plate. Separate the filter cap from the base by pressing the release buttons and lifting. Remove the filter plate gently from the locating clips at the rear of the drain. Do not attempt to remove the filter by force as this may cause damage. Clean under hot water and rinse thoroughly.

Care and Cleaning

Replacing the filters:






- I. Align the filter cap with the notch on the filter base for one side.
- 2. Press the button to clip the filter cap under the filter base locating notches for the other sides.
- 3. Slot the filter plate under the locating clips at the rear of the drain and push firmly back into the clips. Ensure the filter plate is flush with the dishwasher base.
- 4. Place the drain filter back into the dishwasher base. Rotate the filter handle clockwise to click into place.

Care and Cleaning

Care and Cleaning of the Spray Arms


Spray arms should be regularly inspected for dirt. If needed the spray arms could be removed.



Do not remove the top spray arm for cleaning.

Clean with a small, plastic-bristled brush. If heavily soiled or blocked use a dishwasher cleaner/descaler. Follow the manufacturer's instructions.

Cleaning the Upper spray arm



To remove the upper spray arm, turn the locking nut clockwise to release. Rinse the spray arm thoroughly under running water, then refit.

Cleaning the lower spray arm

To remove the lower spray arm, lift it from the base of the dishwasher. Rinse the spray arm thoroughly under running water, then refit. Ensure the arm rotates freely when refitted.

External Cleaning



CAUTION!

Never clean the appliance with a steam cleaner.

Never use bleach or other chlorinated detergents.

- Clean the appliance with a damp soft cloth.
- Only use neutral detergents. Do not use abrasive products, abrasive cleaning pads or solvents.
- Clean the door seal with a damp soft cloth.


