#### **Intended Use**

The appliance is designed for domestic use, including the below environments inside the house, staff kitchen areas, farm houses, hotels, motels or other residential environments. It is not intended forcommercial or industrial use. Do not use it for purposes other than that for which it was designed.

Changes or modifications to the device are not allowed. Unintended use may cause hazards and loss of warranty claims.

# Before Switching on the Appliance for the First Time Do...

- ▶ to make sure all packaging is removed and is kept out of children's reach.
- ▶ to make sure that the electrical information on the rating plate agrees with the power supply, if not, contact with electricians.
- ▶ use a separate earthed socket for the power supply. The appliance must be earthed.
- ▶ to make sure the plug is accessible.
- ▶ to make sure only the delivered electric cable and hose set are used.
- ▶ hold the plug and not the electric cable when unplugging the power supply.
- ▶ to make sure not to damage the electric cable and the plug. If dam aged, have it replaced by an electrician.
- ▶ to make sure the hose joints and connections are firmed and there is no leakage.

#### Do not...

- install or use the appliance where the temperature is below 5 °C. Use multi-plug adapters and extension cables.
- \* let people (children included), with reduced physical sensory, and mental functions or lack of experience and knowledge use the appliance also not supervised by a person, who is responsible for their safety.
- put wet flammable products in, near, or on the appliance.

# During Daily Use

- supervise children and stop them to play with the appliance.
- put sharp pointed objects (e.g. knives) in a way that there is no danger of injury.

#### Do not...

- x open the door while a programme is operating. The appliance can releasehot steam.
- \* keep the appliance door open without supervision to prevent tripping and falling.
- x let children or pets come close to the appliance when the door is open.
- x sit or place heavy items on the open door.
- \* remove the dishes from the appliance until the programme is completed. Otherwise, there can still be detergent on the dishes.
- x drink the water in the appliance. The water may be contaminated with detergent residues.
- x cover any ventilation openings in the base by a carpet or similar object.
- x use water spray or steam to clean the appliance.
- \* let the children make the cleaning and user maintenance without supervision.

#### **WARNING:**

Some dishwasher detergents are strongly alkaline. They can be extremely dangerous if swallowed. Avoid touch with the skin and eyes and keep children away from the dishwasher when the door is open. Check that the detergent receptacle is empty after completion of the wash cycle.

- The door is not left in the open position since this could present a tripping hazard.
- Warning: Knives and other utensils with sharp points must be loaded in the basket with their points down or placed in a horizontal position.
- Only use hose-set provided by manufacture, old hose-set cannot be reused.



#### **WARNING!**

Any installation need to carried out only by a qualified technician refer to section "safety".


### Free Standing Installation

Install the appliance on horizontal ground.


Adjust accurately all feet to get a firm, horizontal position.




Only with a correct level the appliance door closes and seals correctly.



### **Installation under Worktop**





- I. Optional:Remove the worktop of the appliance.
- 2. Adjust accurately all feet to get a firm level position.
- 3. Install the appliance carefully into the recess.




#### WARNING!

If used as free standing appliance again, the worktop must be remounted.

- 4. The dimensions of the recess should at least match with the dimensions in the figure
- 5. After installation, the minmum gap between the side planel and the cupboard is 1mm, and the minmum gap between the rear and the cupboard is 10mm. The top gap is controlled by adjusting the feet.
- 6. Put the appliance adjacent to the slot. Make sure that all connections (water, drain water, power) are neatly positioned and connected.


#### **Fresh Water Connection**



#### **IMPORTANT!**


- ▶ The appliance should be connected to the water main using the new water inlet hose supplied. Old hoses shouldn't be used.
- ▶ Don't shorten the inlet hose.
- 1. Take note of water connection requirements.
  - ▶ The dishwasher has a single valve water connection.
  - ▶ We recommend a cold water connection for best performance and energy efficiency.
  - ▶ The incoming water temperature shouldn't exceed 25°C.
- 2. Take note of the permitted water pressure extremes.
  - Lowest:  $0.3 \text{ bar} = 3 \text{ N/cm}^2 = 30 \text{kPa}$
  - ▶ Where pressure is below I bar, contact with qualified plumbers.
  - $\blacktriangleright$  Highest: 10 bar = 100 N/cm<sup>2</sup> = IMPa
  - ▶ Where pressure is above 10 bar, a pressure reduction valve must be installed. Contact with qualified plumbers.
- 3. Connect the water inlet hose to an accessible water tap with a 3/4" BSP connector (see fig.A). Ensure that there is no kink in the inlet hose, because this will restrict the flow of water. A 90° bend requires a minimum height of 200 mm for a kink-free curve.
  - ▶ Ensure incoming water is clear. If the water pipes have not been used for a long period, let the water run in the pipes, to make sure it is clear with no impurities. If not, it will result in the water inlet hose getting blocked and damaging the appliance.
  - ▶ If required, use a filter insert to filter out deposits from the piping. The filter insert is available from your authorised service centre or customer care.
- 4. Tighten the hose coupling a further half turn after seal contact.
- 5. Confirm that the connections don't leak.

### **Drain Water Connection**




Fix the water drain hose properly to the piping. The hose has to reach at one point a height between 400 and 850 mm above the appliance bottom line. An extension hose for the water drain hose can't exceed a total length of 4m and must have the same diameter as the water drain hose.

#### Drain hose to waste water connection




- ► The internal diameter of the stand pipe with vent-hole must be minimum 40 mm.
- Put the drain hose for approx.80 mm in the wastewater pipe.
- ► The top of the drainage pipe is fixed with a tie, and the height of the tie must be higher than the height of the drainage pipe mouth

#### Drain hose to sink connection



- ▶ When connecting the drain hose to a sink trap with a drain hose spigot, make sure that the drain hose is supported to the height of the bench.
- ▶ Ensure the drain spigot has a minimum hole diameter of 15 mm and it has been drilled out.

#### **Power connection**



As shown in the data, the power supply is plugged into an externally accessible place through the service hole for easy plugging.




#### **CAUTION!**

Always ensure that all connections (power supply, drain and fresh water hose) are firm, dry and not leaked.

Take care these parts are never to be crushed, kinked, or twisted If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the service agent (see warranty card) in order to avoid hazards.





While running it may be limited to local conditions and daily working load.

I). The Auto and Hygiene programs can automatically detect the dirty degree and it will adjust the temperature, water volume, and programs automaticly.

## First Step

Remove all packaging materials, keep them out of children's reach and dispose them in an environmentally manner. There could be waterresidue inside the appliance due to quality checks in the factory.

Perform in the following steps:

- I. Install the appliance.
  - ▶ Refer to section INSTALLATION.
- 2. Only for use of multitabs: adjust the rinse aid setting.
  - ▶ Refer to section DIFFERENT SETTINGS FOR RINSE AID.
- 3. Fill the rinse aid dispenser.
  - ▶ Refer to section HOW TO FILL THE RINSE AID DISPENSER.
- 4. Open the water tap.
- 5. Start any wash programme (apart from Rinse programme) with detergent but no load to remove possible manufacturing residues.

### Activate / De-Activate the Buzzer

An accoustic signal informs about the end of a programme. This signal can be switched off.

Refer to section HOW TO ADJUST SETTINGS and select the setting:

- ▶ If the display shows ⊢□ the signal is switched off.
- ▶ If the display shows 🖥 i the signal is switched on.

## **Different Settings for Rinse Aid**

Rinse aid is added during the last rinsing phase to dry the dishes without streaks and stains.

## Detergent (e.g. powder, tablets, ...)

▶ require separate rinse aid:
 Factory default setting: ☐☐ .No settings are necessary.
 The rinse aid is added from the rinse aid dispenser only.

## Detergent with multifunction (e.g. Multitabs)

• combine detergent and rinse aid:

The rinse aid setting should be adjust to  $\Box\Box$ . Please use the setting instructions in section HOW TO ADJUST SETTINGS and select the  $\Box$ -setting.

The rinse aid is added from the rinse aid dispenser in addition to the multitabs rinse aid.

Setting d - cuts off the rinse aid dosage and the rinse aid indication. The higher the value for the higher the dosage.

Usually the recommended setting performs well. In case of streaks, stains, shimmer etc., refer to section TROUBLESHOOTING.


## How to fill the Rinse Aid Dispenser



#### **CAUTION!**

Only use rinse aid for dishwashers.

Other products will result in damage to the appliance.



Lift the cover open and pour rinse aid into the opening.

Don't fill the rinse aid over the MAX line

Take care and don't spill any onto the door or detergent bucket.



Close the cover, ensure it clicks shut.

## Powder detergent quantity recommendations

Use the table below to determine the optimal powder detergent quantity for each wash programme.

If the water quality is poor in your area, more detergent may be required.

Refer to 'Water Hardness' for more details.

## **How to Adjust Settings**

### Adjust the Rinse Aid level

- I. The appliance is switched on.
- 2. Press and hold ≫about 3 seconds until:
  - ▶ The display shows the current Rinse Aid setting (the default is  $\neg \Box$ ).
- 3. Press  $\stackrel{\square}{}$  to change the Rinse Aid setting in steps between  $\stackrel{\square}{}$  (minimum dispense, no rinse aid is set) and  $\stackrel{\square}{}$  (maximum dispense, represents putting in 6ml rinse aid).
- 4. Press > ∥ to save the option.
- 5. To exit the Rinse Aid menu, press and hold (1) for I second.

#### Activate / De-Activate the Buzzer

- I. The appliance is switched on.
- 2. Press and hold >> for about 3 seconds until:
  - ▶ The display shows the current Rinse Aid setting.
- 3. Press >>> to scroll to the buzzer menu.
- 4. The display will show  $\frac{1}{10}$  (buzzer off) or  $\frac{1}{10}$  (buzzer on).
- 5. Press  $\stackrel{\square}{}$  to toggle between  $\stackrel{\square}{}$  (buzzer off) or  $\stackrel{\square}{}$  (buzzer on),
- 6. Press | to save the option.
- 7. To exit, press and hold  $\bigcirc$  I second.

#### Child Lock

This feature disables all the buttons on the dishwasher. If any other buttons are pressed while Child Lock is activated, the Child Lock indicator will flashfor a few seconds.

- 1. To activate Child Lock, press  $(\ \ )$  and  $(\ \ )$  for 3 seconds.
- 2. The display will remain on (if no programme has been started it will continue to flash while the control panel is locked).
- 3. To cancel Child Lock, press (L) and |L| for 3 seconds.

## **Before first use**

## Dishwasher operation

- I. Load the baskets.
- 2. Press the ON/OFF button ( ) to activate the appliance.
  - If the rinse aid indicator is on, fill the rinse aid dispenser and reset the rinse aid indicator, refer to section HOW TO RESET THE RINSE AID IDNICATOR.
- 3. Add the detergent; refer to section DETERGENT.
- 4. Close the door.
- 5. Set the program according to the type of load and how dirty the dishes, cups and cutlery are.
- 6. Maybe select a start delay time.
- 7. Press the START / PAUSE button >|| to start the program.
- 8. After the program ends the appliance changes to auto-off. Unload the baskets

### How to Reset Rinse Aid Indicator

The rinse aid indicator is on:

- 1. Always completely fill the rinse aid before starting the next wash cycle.
- 2. After each filling, press and hold the | button for 5 seconds to turn off the indicator light.

#### Load the Baskets




With delicate glasses and porcelain make sure they are labelled dishwasher-proof.

- **x** Do not put in the appliance items made of wood, horn, aluminium, pewter and copper.
- Do not put in the appliance items that can absorb water (sponges, household clothes).
- Only use the appliance to wash items that are dishwasher-safe items.
- Remove the remaining food from the items.
- Soften burned food on the items before washing.
- ▶ Put hollow items (cups, glasses and pans) with the opening down.
- Put items with deep hollows in a slanted position.
- Mix spoons with other cutlery to prevent them from bonding together.
- ▶ Make sure that cutlery and dishes do not bond together and that there is a gap between each item.
- Make sure that glasses do not touch other glasses.
- ▶ Put small items in the cutlery basket.
- Put light items in the upper basket. Make sure that the items do not move.
- ▶ Make sure the spray arms can move freely before starting a program.



If jingling noises are heard during a program run: Check that the dishes and glassware have a firm position.



Place heavily soiled items (like pots and pans or dinner plates) in the bottom basket. The more powerful spray jet provides a better dishwashing result.


## **Upper baskets**



► The upper basket is designed to hold items like glasses, cups, saucers, plates, small bowls and shallow pans.

### Adjusting the height of the upper basket

Adjust the height of the upper basket to make space for taller items. The basket must be empty before the height is adjusted. Both sides of the basket must be adjusted to the same height.



#### High position

When the middle shelf slide is in the assembly position of wheel I and wheel 2, the middle shelf is in the high position.

#### Low position

When the middle shelf slide is in the assembly position of wheel 2 and wheel 3, the middle shelf is in the low position.

#### Foldaway cup racks



The cup racks can be folded or opened according to needs. When opened, tea cups can be placed on top, and folding can save space for other items.

#### Lower basket



- Place the largest items here: pots, pans, lids, serving dishes and bowls.
- Ensure dishware items do not block the spray arm above from rotating.
- ► If you need more height for tall items, you can raise the upper basket. See instructions on previous pages.

### **Cutlery basket**



- ► Mix spoons with other cutlery to prevent them to bond together.
- ► Use the grid element in order to separate the cutlery.
- ► Place cutlery with the handles down for better washing results.
- ▶ If long items may block the spray arm find a horizontal positioning in the upper basket.

#### **CAUTION!**



Put sharp and pointed items with the blade pointing downward to keep them out of harm's way.


### **Detergent**



Please use only a dedicated dishwasher detergent and follow the related instructions and dosage on its package.

#### Using powder detergent

For powder detergent quantities, refer to the following 'Powder detergent quantity recommendations' table and the detergent manufacturer's guidance. No detergent is needed for a rinse cycle.



Check that the dispenser is empty and dry. Add powder detergent or tablets to the detergent dispenser.



Remove any excess detergent then slide the cover closed. It will click into place. If required, add additional detergent to the pre-wash compartment on top of the dispenser.

When washing heavily soiled dishware in hard water, more detergent may be required. Refer to 'Powder detergent quantity recommendations'.

#### **Multitabs**

These Multitabs detergent tablets could include two different agents for water softening, rinse aid and other functions. The softener and rinse aid settings must be adjusted according to section BEFORE FIRST USE. Usually the default setting performs well. If there are streaks, stains, shimmer etc., refer to section TROUBLESHOOTING and BEFORE FIRST USE.



Detergent tablets do not fully dissolve with short programs. That may cause bad washing results and detergent residues.

If detergent without multifunction should be used again:

- I. Save 3 to 5 tablets.
- 2. Adjust the softener and rinse aid setting according to section BEFORE FIRST USE.
- 3. Use Multitabs detergent tablets for the next 3 to 5 wash cycles.

### Start a Program

- I. Close the door.
- 2. Press the ON/OFF button(|).
- 3. Press the program button you want to select and then the required program indicator flashes.
  - Additionally the display shows the program run-time.
- 4. If need select a start time for a delayed start, refer to the section START A PROGRAM WITH DELAY.
- 5. Press the START/PAUSE button >|| to activate the program or the delay start.

The program starts. The display acts now as a countdown of the remaining run-time.



The appliance remembers the last programme you used. The next time the appliance is switched on, the appliance pre-selects the programme used last time.

## **Interrupt a Running Program**

To interrupt a running program:

- Press the START/PAUSE button ▷|| . The displayed cycle time is flashing.
- Open the door.

#### To continue a paused program:

Close the door and press the button |D|| to continue the program from the point of interruption. To prevent poor wash performance, do not leave the door open for a long time.

### Start a Program with Delay

Set a start time by the following procedure in order to delay a program start:

- I. Set a program.
- 2. Press the reservation button (L) until the display shows the required delay time (from 1 to 24hours).
- 3. Press the START/PAUSE button  $|\mathbf{x}|$ .
  - ▶ The display shows the countdown of the start delay.
  - ▶ When the countdown is completed, the program starts.

## **Cancel a Delayed Start**

When the current reservation time is displayed for 24 hours, press the reservation (L) button again to cancel the reservation. Afterwards, the display shows the duration time for the set program.

### Cancel Start Delay Program

Press the ON/OFF button (|) for about I second.

- ▶ The start delay is cancelled.
- ▶ The program is aborted.
- ▶ The appliance is switched off.

Start a new program and a delayed start if needed.



#### **CAUTION!**

If a program is aborted in the process of washing dishes, the residue of detergent remains on the dishes. These can cause damage to health. Make sure to rinse off the detergent residues completely before using these dishes again.



If the door is opened immediately after the end of program, hot steam can escape. The danger of scalding. Open the door carefully.



Make sure that there is detergent in the detergent dispenser before starting a new program.

## Care and Cleaning

## Cleaning the filter, spray arms and filter plate

Disconnect the dishwasher from the power supply and allow it to cool before undertaking any cleaning or maintenance.


We recommend that the drain filter and filter plate be removed and cleaned once a month or whenever there is evidence of food particles. The spray arms in normal use should require cleaning less frequently. Lower and upper spray arms can be shaken to remove any foreign material, cleaned in hot water, and then rinsed in clean water.

The dishwasher must be used with the filter plate, drain filter and spray arms correctly in place. If using a dishwasher cleaner or descaler, refer to manufacturer instructions.

## Removing and cleaning the filter



Twist the filter anticlockwise to release. Lift to remove.





Twist the filter handle anticlockwise to release. Lift to remove from the filter plate. Separate the filter cap from the base by pressing the release buttons and lifting. Remove the filter plate gently from the locating clips at the rear of the drain. Do not attempt to remove the filter by force as this may cause damage. Clean under hot water and rinse thoroughly.

# Care and Cleaning

### Replacing the filters:






- I. Align the filter cap with the notch on the filter base for one side.
- 2. Press the button to clip the filter cap under the filter base locating notches for the other sides.
- 3. Slot the filter plate under the locating clips at the rear of the drain and push firmly back into the clips. Ensure the filter plate is flush with the dishwasher base.
- 4. Place the drain filter back into the dishwasher base. Rotate the filter handle clockwise to click into place.

## **Care and Cleaning**

### **Care and Cleaning of the Spray Arms**

Spray arms should be regularly inspected for dirt. If needed the spray arms could be removed.

## Cleaning the Upper spray arm



To remove the upper spray arm, turn the locking nut clockwise to release. Rinse the spray arm thoroughly under running water, then refit.

## Cleaning the lower spray arm

To remove the lower spray arm, lift it from the base of the dishwasher. Rinse the spray arm thoroughly under running water, then refit. Ensure the arm rotates freely when refitted.

### **External Cleaning**



#### **CAUTION!**

Never clean the appliance with a steam cleaner.

Never use bleach or other chlorinated detergents.

- ▶ Clean the appliance with a damp soft cloth.
- Only use neutral detergents. Do not use abrasive products, abrasive cleaning pads or solvents.
- ▶ Clean the door seal with a damp soft cloth.

## **Troubleshooting**

Many occurring problems could be solved by yourself without specificexpertise. In case of a problem please check all shown possibilities and followbelow instructions before you contact an after-sales service.



#### **CAUTION!**

- ▶ Before maintenance, deactivate the appliance and disconnect the power plug from the power socket.
